
CALCINED CLAY DRYING AGENT FOR INFIELDS

WET FIELD CONDITIONS


- 1. Before applying any ProDry Drying Agent, remove as much water as possible from puddles by first using puddle pillows or puddle pumps.
- 2. Apply ProDry to wet areas and allow drying agent to absorb excess moisture.
- 3. Rake or drag smooth.
- 4. Remove excess the next day if topdressing exceeds 1/3".
- 4. Apply drying agent to puddles in turfgrass and rake surrounding area. Turfgrass will fill in, eliminating low areas.


